Roy's Ramblings: Elder Retreat Recap

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Hebrews 13:17 says that local church leaders (elders) are to keep watch over the souls of those in the church. It also says that church leaders will one day give an account before God for how well we fulfill this responsibility. Church leadership is serious business. It's serious because it's God's business.

My 6 year old daughter recently asked me "Daddy are you the boss of the church?" I quickly replied "No, God is the boss of the church" and He is. He better be. The church is not ours to do with whatever we want. The Holy Spirit assigns the leaders, and Jesus paid for the church with his blood (Acts 20:28). We meet as a team every other Friday morning for prayer and discussion, talk face to face regularly, and stay in almost daily contact via email. But this retreat gave us an extended time to pray, discuss, and assess in detail the overall health of our church family.

Leading up to the retreat we had all read a very helpful book Nine Marks of a Healthy Church by Mark Dever. Church health is not something you hear talked about much. It seems we get preoccupied with the "Three B's of church: Buildings, Budgets, and Behinds in seats." Not to say that these things have no significance, but Scripture teaches that there's much more. As Dever points out, "Biblically, we must realize that the size of what our eyes see is rarely a good way to estimate the greatness of something in the eyes of God." We can't be content to merely "do church" when Christ has called us to "BE THE CHURCH."

I told our elders last Sunday evening following our elder retreat that I can't recall a time when I have ever been more encouraged in ministry. God has a great plan to use our church for his glory and our joy. As we remain faithful to Him and His Word, He is making that plan more and more evident and clear. Do we as your church leaders have everything figured out? No. We're not the perfect church, nor will we be. We're human. We're sinful. We've made mistakes and we'll make more. We desperately need Grace, just like you and everyone else. But we are striving, by God's Grace, to make our church

the most faithful, loving, healthy reflection of his Word that we can, this side of Heaven.

The rest of our church leadership and I are committed to the mission of making disciples. We envision a committed body of believers deeply CONNECTED to Christ and to one another, GROWING into a dynamic, mature relationship with Him, and SERVING God and our communities with all that has been entrusted to us. We are committed to this mission and vision. We are committed to YOU as our church family. I hope that brings you great encouragement as a member of this church.


