October is Pastor Appreciation Month! GBF will honor Brother Roy, as well as Byron, Alicia and Price, on Sunday, October 30, during worship.

There are many ways to show our leaders how much we appreciate the role of a pastor and ministry directors. Dennis Rainey at www.familylife.com offers a few simple acts of caring that you can use this month to let pastors know that you appreciate the load they carry: the pressure of caring for sheep, the pace of a growing ministry and the daily sacrifices made for ministry. Communicate that you understand they do more than just show up on Sundays and Wednesdays.

- Invite the pastor and family to lunch after church.
- Write a hand-written note of appreciation for who he/she is and how God has used him/her in your life. Be specific; avoid broad generalizations.
- Pray for them daily. Then call them and tell them you're doing just that and ask for their prayer requests pray for their families, too.
- Give gift certificates for restaurants, gas or other necessities.
- Offer to babysit for an evening or weekend if they have small children.
- Offer your handyman skills to help fix things around his/her home or office. Knocking those out can be a huge stress relief.
- Arrange for a housekeeping service to clean his/her house, or offer your services!
- Occasionally send the pastor a clever cartoon or joke that mirrors a point he made in a sermon just so he'll know that you're listening!
- Pick up and clean his/her car while their at the church office one day.
- Call and express appreciation to our leaders. Be specific about how they helped you.
- Volunteer at church. One of the greatest gifts for a pastor and staff is to have obedient, willing servants to consistently fill the needs of the church.
- Don't forget their spouses and families. They make many sacrifices in giving up their husband/wife/mom/dad to ministry opportunities. Send notes of appreciation, flowers or a gift certificate.





NIGHT OF WORSHIP

Every couple of months, the GBF Student Ministry hosts a Night of Worship (NOW).

During a NOW, we set aside the entire night for expressing the worth of God through song and personal testimony. Several students stand up and share what God has been doing in their life. It is very encouraging to hear teenagers speak so boldly about their faith in front of their peers. Their faith is most definitely personal, but not private. There is also time set aside for youth leaders to gather with their small group and pray for them. These are very special nights.

When we assemble for a NOW, we are demonstrating that Christianity is not a solo mission. Many people, not just teenagers, try to go at this faith alone and end up feeling exhausted, beaten down, and short-sided. Singing worship songs alone in your car or in your home is fantastic, but it does not stir up your affections for Jesus like gathering and singing with a group of other believers. Gathering with other believers encourages one another and lets us know that we are not alone in this faith.

This world is harsh and it is even harsher for a Christian because they are constantly made to feel like an outcast. But when you are worshipping God with your brothers and sisters in the faith, you no longer feel like the outcast. You feel a sense of belonging. Very few things rejuvenate the soul quite like gathering with one's church family and singing about what Jesus has done for each and every one of us.

A REAL Man

In our men's study recently, we discussed how the world typically measures manhood by 3 B's:

- 1. Billfold (how much \$\$ we have/make)
- 2. Ball-field (how athletic we are/sports knowledge or accomplishments)
- 3. Bedroom (how we perform sexually/how well we do with the ladies)

It goes without saying, God measures manhood differently. We looked at a definition that used the acronym REAL for what a REAL man does:

Rejects passivity

Expects God's greater reward

Accepts responsibility

Leads courageously

The thing that resonated most with our group this morning was "rejects passivity." As men, we tend to get complacent about the things that are most important. When we do this, we are acting more like Adam than we are like Jesus. The 2 minute video at the link below elaborates on how we inherited passivity from Adam, but we see initiative and action in Jesus Christ. As Christians our highest goal is to follow Jesus.
