










JANUARY THEME: COMMITMENT

This guy's actions made me think of what sometimes goes on in my heart when things don't go the way I think they should. No, I don't tear up my house, but my mind and emotions can be given over to deep frustration and anger. For me it's not the Cowboys, I've had to get use to them losing over the years:)

For me, it might be something with my family, my work, even just frustration with myself. Anybody else struggle with letting circumstances rule your emotions and rob you of your joy?

The Christian life shouldn't be a roller coaster of anger and frustration. Our hearts should be ruled by Jesus Christ, not out circumstances. That's why we call Jesus "Lord", because he's OVER ALL.

So if Jesus, The Prince of Peace, is King of my heart, why am at times I given over to frustration and anger??? Because I'm sinful and forgetful of greatness and satisfaction that comes from God alone. I let important things become ultimate things. I, and maybe you too, need to be reminded that my ultimate value and identity rests not in my circumstances, but rather in my relationship with God.

This doesn't mean that throws of life are not important, they are! It just means that circumstances of life can't leg-sweep us like Johnny did Daniel Larusso in Karate Kid.

Eric Mason said "When God isn't enough, nothing will be." That is the TRUTH! Without God in His rightful place in our life, we can't truly enjoy anything, because whatever occupies the rightful place of God, can crush us at anytime when we lose it. - 4. **Develop a positive habit:** There may be other areas in your life that you may feel you should be working on. These may include eating better, sleeping better, exercising more, getting more organized etc. Remember we are physical beings as well as spiritual. We need to be working on both to be functional!


